## **Current Training Package Updates**

- An update was provided to the IRC on all Certificate II & III revision work carried out to date and an update was provided on the two new Certificate IV projects.
- IRC considered the TAC nominations for the Certificate IV review and made recommendations and TAC was approved by the IRC
- The IRC were informed that only one RTO had applied to deliver the New Diploma in Water in Queensland.
- AIS provided a research brief on new industry trends for the Water IRC to consider for future skilling needs
- The current Units of Competency regarding fluoride guide doesn't meet NSW requirements. AIS and the NSW Water Directorate will investigate further if a new unit is needed or if it can be incorporated in the Broader Awareness of all dangerous goods. (Including fluoride treatment) The regulator in NSW is asking for a unit in this area.
- AIS will send out a brief to the IRC after the discussions and options for incorporating the awareness of fluoride treatment.
- AIS & IRC will draft a letter responding to the strong Industry feedback about the changing workplace and the need to allow flexibility in Skill Sets
- Considering outcomes of the Joyce Review the IRC discussed an action plan going forward and will set up a working group
