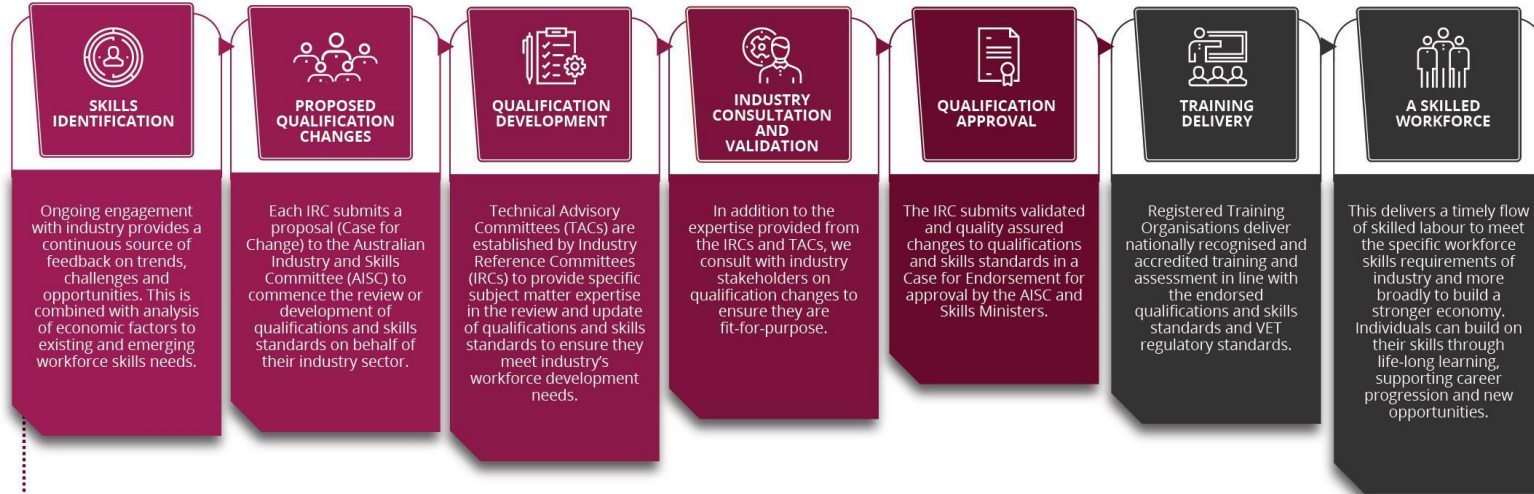

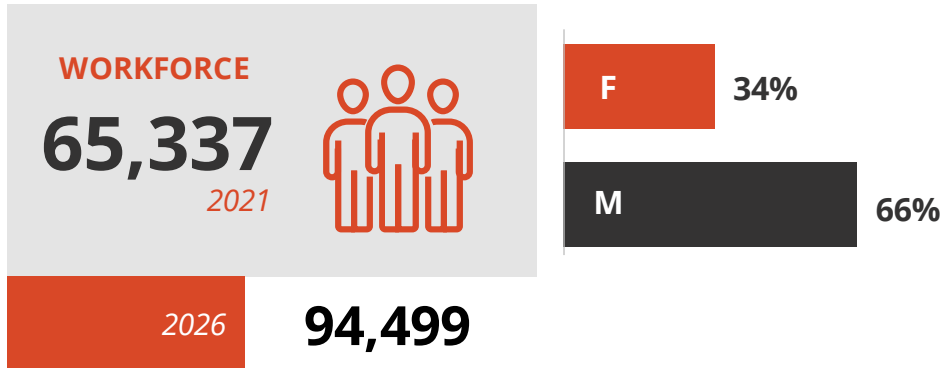
AVIATION SECTOR

AVIATION IRC SKILLS FOCUS



The Certificate IV Aviation (Flight Operations Supervision) and Advanced Diploma Aviation (Chief Flight Instructor) are both proposed for deletion. Units of Competency in these qualifications may be added as streams to existing qualifications to align with industry.



Drone technology is projected to create up to 5,500 new full-time jobs each year for the next two decades. There is a need for more aviation workers with skills in digital, telecommunications and automation technologies.



New technologies for air traffic control operations and monitoring requires new skills for the workforce.



Safety and compliance are of utmost importance. There have been recent regulatory updates to drug and alcohol management in the industry. There have also been changes to regulations regarding flight operations and aircraft spin aspects.
